

REGULATIONS

1. The competition involves creating an Old School hairstyle within a maximum of 40 minutes.
2. All participants must be at least 18 years old.
3. Mentors are allowed to provide advisory assistance (the mentor must be registered with the head of the jury before the competition).
4. The winner will be the participant who scores the highest points from the jury.
5. Participants must use their own models. Each participant is responsible for providing a model that meets the competition's requirements.
6. Hair length before the haircut: hair on the top must be at least 15 cm, and hair on the sides must be at least 5 cm.
7. Hair length after the haircut: the top must be at least 10 cm, and the sides must be at least 2 cm.
8. Models with signs of prior preparation will be disqualified, and the participants will be excluded from the competition.
9. Allowed tools: razors, scissors, thinning shears, hair dryers, spray bottles, combs, Chinese knives, styling brushes.
10. Allowed cosmetics: pomades, pastes, waxes, hairsprays, talcum powder, hair-setting powders.
11. Prohibited items: clippers, trimmers, straighteners, curling irons, wavers, round styling brushes.
12. Prohibited cosmetics: coloring powders, coloring gels, spray paints, coloring foams, dyes.
13. Cutting time: 40 minutes.
14. Participants must leave their workstations once the time is up.
15. Participants who finish before the allotted time must raise their hand, prepare the model for the judges, and leave their station.
16. The jury comprises three main judges and the head of the judging panel.
17. Transparent scoring: the jury evaluates the model in person.
18. The jury awards points on a scale from 0 to 10 in the following categories: cutting time, contours, styling according to the competition theme, finishing touches, and attire fitting the theme.
19. The jury scores independently without discussing the competition.
20. The jury may assign negative points for violations such as using prohibited items, starting before the official start, or continuing after the allotted time, or if the model shows signs of prior preparation.
21. The jury can issue a red card, disqualifying a participant for starting work before the competition or continuing after the allotted time and using prohibited equipment.
